2021-2022 School Year

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes 66.03.01, 120.25, and Department of Public Instruction Chapter PI-14.02, the school districts of Medford, Gilman, Owen Withee, and Colby have agreed to form a consortium for the purpose of providing services to students with an IEP who are between the ages 18-21 years of old and their class has graduated from high school.

Description of the Program (PI-14.02 (b)):

- SOAR program is an opportunity for 18-21 year old students with disabilities who have an IEP
 that need additional time to work on IEP goals/objectives in the areas of independent/daily living,

The Three Lakes School District will be provided access to all the courses available through the Wisconsin eSchool Network (Wisconsin Digital Learning Collaborative) and other curricular contracts held by the RVA. Professional development and ongoing technical support and training will be provided to the Three Lakes School District staff by the RVA.

The Three Lakes School District will be charged all associated costs for content of digital courses in the same amount the RVA is charged for acquiring those courses from the Wisconsin eSchool Network and other curriculum vendors under contract with the RVA. This amount is fixed at the rate per courses which are "licensed," "owned," or "digital access" by the Wisconsin eSchool Network, or other curriculum vendors under contract with the RVA, and billed at the end of year reconciliation.

The Three Lakes School District will be charged a per course/ student/ semester "instructional fee" for any classes taken by Three Lakes School District students, in RVA teacher directed courses. This cost is variable depending upon type of instructional support needed. This amount is fixed and billed at the end of year reconciliation and is in addition to the cost for course content.

The RVA will prepare a preliminary budget for the virtual learning services with actual and final reconciliation prior to June 30, 2021. In this way, the proration of costs will be

made on a basis which is fair and equitable to each participant.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) Board of Education (BOE) recognizes its responsibility for preserving the safety, protecting the general welfare and promoting the physical, mental and emotional health of individual students, employees, student body and staff. The health and safety of students and staff will be the primary consideration in dealing with communicable disease. This policy's intent is to minimize interruptions to the educational programs of the schools.

MAPSD shall follow federal regulations, state statutes, administrative rules, county and city ordinances and the procedures required by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services regarding communicable disease. The BOE will may utilize the recommendations and services of a medical advisor and legal counsel when necessary.

While participating in school-related activities or while on school premises, no student shall refuse to interact or work with other students or staff because they have (or may have) a communicable disease if the communicable disease does not pose a significant health risk to others. At the same time no employee shall refuse to perform their duties or refuse to work with, or provide services to, students or staff because they have (or may have) a communicable disease if the communicable disease does not pose a significant health risk to others. The determination of whether a communicable disease poses a significant health risk to others shall be made by the school nurse in consultation with the district medical advisor in accordance with policy guidelines. Said determination shall be based solely upon the available medical evidence.

Exclusion from School for Certain Communicable Diseases

The school nurse or designee may exclude a student from school with a communicable disease that poses a high degree of risk to students and staff.

Prior to making a determination that a student should be sent home for diagnosis and treatment or excused from school attendance, the school district nurse shall, to the extent circumstances warrant and permit, inform the student and the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) of the reasons for the contemplated action and shall consider any information the student and/or the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) may choose to offer regarding the student's condition.

In determining when a student should be excused from school, the school nurse or designee will reference the Department of Health Services Wisconsin Childhood Communicable Disease Chart, American Academy of Pediatrics Managing Infectious Disease in Childcare and Schools and/or local public health department.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) will be promptly notified of the exclusion for a possible communicable disease and actions that should be taken for re-admittance to school.

Alternative educational opportunities shall be arranged for students who must be excused from school attendance for a significant period of time.

The health status of a student temporarily removed from the usual school setting to protect the health of self or others will be re-evaluated at regular intervals by the school district nurse in consultation with an IEP Team, local public health department and/or the district medical advisor when appropriate, who shall be responsible for determining when a student may be re-admitted. As a condition of continued or renewed attendance, the district may require a statement from a student's physician that the student is in suitable condition to attend school.

A student should not be excluded from school when the risk of transmission in the school setting is nonexistent or when the district can control the risk of transmission through education of students and staff members and/or the use of supplies to implement hygiene measures.

State Statute and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services

Wisconsin Statutes give the Department of Health Services the authority to implement all emergency measures necessary to control communicable diseases.

In accordance with Wis. Stat. sec. 252.21 and Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 145.04, if a school nurse, teacher or principal knows or suspects that a certain communicable disease is present, they must report it to the local public health department. Reportable communicable diseases are noted on the Wisconsin Childhood Communicable Disease Chart from the Department of Health Services.

For Wis. Admin. Code HSS 145.04(1)(d) and 145.04(2); report name and address of the reporter, of the individual with a diagnosed or suspected disease and of their attending physician, together with additional information about the individual with the diagnosed or suspected disease.

Follow-up and investigative information shall be completed by the local health officer and reported to the state epidemiologist HSS 145.05(1).

Maintenance of Information on Communicable Disease

The school nurse shall maintain guidelines on communicable disease which include, but are not limited to, information on how they are transmitted and methods that could be used to reduce the risks of such transmission.

Because of their sustained contact with school-age children, school employees are in an excellent position to identify abused or neglected children and to refer them for treatment and protection.

Medford Area Public School District Board of Education (BOE) policy is that any staff member who in the course of their professional duties has reasonable cause to suspect that a child has been abused, neglected, or threatened with abuse or neglect shall report to Taylor County Human Services, following the procedures as outlined in JHG-R.

It is not the responsibility of school personnel to prove that the child has been abused or neglected, nor to determine whether the child is in need of protection. School personnel shall not contact the child's family or any other person to determine the cause of any suspected abuse or neglect.

No district employee shall be discharged from employment for making such a report. In addition, state law guarantees immunity from any civil or criminal liability that may result from making a report of child abuse or neglect. State law also provides for the protection of the identity of any individual who makes such a report.

The district administrator may establish any necessary procedures to implement this policy and to comply with state law.

Definitions

For purposes of implementing BOE policy, the following definitions will be used:

Child - Any person under 18 years of age.

Child Abuse - "Abuse" means any of the following:

- Physical injury inflicted on a child by other than accidental means.
- Sexual intercourse or "sexual contact" under §940.225(5)(a), 948.02, 948.025, or 948.085:
- Sexual exploitation of a child; as defined under §948.05;
- · Permitting, allowing or encouraging a child to engage in prostitution as defined in §944.30;
- Causing a child to view or listen to sexual activity under §948.055;
- For purposes of sexual arousal or gratification, either causing a child to expose genitals or pubic area or exposing genitals or pubic area to a child under §948.1;
- Manufacturing methamphetamine in violation of §961.41(1)(e) under any of the following circumstances:
 - With a child physically present during the manufacture.
 - In a child's home, on the premises of a child's home, or in a motor vehicle located on the premises of a child's home.
 - Under any other circumstances in which a reasonable person should have known that the manufacture would be seen, smelled or heard by a child.
- Emotional damage for which the child's parent(s)/guardian(s) or legal custodian has neglected, refused or been unable for reasons other than poverty to obtain the necessary treatment or to take steps to ameliorate the symptoms.

Child Neglect - "Neglect" means failure, refusal or inability on the part of a caregiver for reasons other than poverty, to provide necessary care, food, clothing, medical or dental care or shelter so as to seriously endanger the physical or emotional health of the child.

Reporting and Follow-up Procedures:

- Any district employee who, in the performance of their professional duties, either suspects or who has good reason to believe that child abuse or neglect has or will occur should shall, as soon as possible, contact, in person or by phone, Taylor County Human Services and inform the agency of the facts and circumstances contributing to the suspicion of child abuse or neglect or to a belief that abuse will occur. This may be done by the employee or in concert with the building principal, nurse, guidance counselor or school psychologist; however, it is clearly the legal obligation of the suspecting educator to make the referral. If no referral is made, they are legally responsible. The following information will be required:
 - > Your name, position, relationship to the child, the school phone number.
 - > Child's name, home address and age.
 - > Parent(s)/guardian(s) name, address, work place, names and ages of siblings.
 - Description of suspected child abuse and neglect or the threat of child abuse or neglect, statements of the child, statements allegedly made by the child to others and any surrounding circumstances or conditions in the home of which the reporter is aware.
- Concurrent with the submission of the referral, at the first available opportunity, the staff member will inform the building principal and either the school nurse, guidance counselor or school psychologist of their referral.
- Any person reporting a case may request an immediate investigation by the sheriff or police department if the person has reason to suspect that the child's health or safety is in immediate danger.
- Any personal interview or physical inspection of the child shall be conducted in a professional manner; in the presence of at least one other staff member and in compliance with 118.32, §948.50(2)(b) prohibiting strip searches.
- All district personnel will cooperate in every way possible during the course of the investigation by outside agencies and in providing appropriate assistance to the child involved.
- Any repeated suspicions involving the same child should follow the same procedure.
- · Resolve doubts in reporting in favor of the child.

In order to insure students' safety in the event of a reported enticement attempt, the following guidelines will be observed:

• Upon receipt of an enticement report, the building principal will:

- Contact the district administrator and appropriate law enforcement.
- Inform the student's parent(s)/guardian(s).
- > Interview the student.
- Make a written record of the student's description of events.
- The district administrator or their designee, in consultation with the building principal
 and law enforcement agency, will decide the course of action to be pursued. In all
 cases student identity and personal injury details are to be kept confidential.

Actions to be taken may include, but are not limited to:

- Notifying appropriate staff of the enticement incident.
- Notifying other area schools of the enticement incident.
- Sending notices to families in the school of attendance.
- Making an announcement about personal safety and/or reviewing protective behaviors with students.
- Contacting the press.
- Written records will be kept in the district office.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) Board of Education (BOE) recognizes that suicide and suicide tendencies among youth are continuing problems in the schools and communities across the nation. The BOE also recognizes that it is not a problem that it can deal with alone. Communication and cooperation within the school district and between the home, school and community is crucial.

The BOE establishes this policy in an effort to take positive steps toward preventing childhood/adolescent suicides and to outline procedures by which students can receive professional help and support in the following areas:

- Prevention: To develop within MAPSD a suicide prevention curriculum and to provide all staff members with basic information about, and a recognition of, the signs of suicidal behavior.
- Intervention: To take affirmative action when an immediate referral is warranted and to understand the emergency procedures when a referral is made.
- Postvention: To provide for the needs of students after an act of suicide has taken place.

In the area of prevention, MAPSD, via Student Services (SS) (counselors, nurses, psychologists, etc.), will inform district staff on a regular basis concerning the warning symptoms of and the correct response to a suicidal threat or gesture. Information will be provided to parent(s)/guardian(s) about the warning signals. The school district will include suicide prevention units at appropriate levels of the regular curriculum.

In the area of intervention, the following procedures apply. When any staff member has a suspicion of possible suicidal behavior, they will make an immediate referral to a member of SS. When dealing with suspected suicidal behavior, confidentiality must be secondary to the concern for the student's life. Action must be taken immediately.

Upon receiving the referral, the SS member will notify the appropriate principal of the referral and will see the indicated student. After talking with the student, the SS member will confer with another member of SS to determine if a serious suicidal threat does, in fact, exist. If, in the professional judgment of the two SS members, it is determined that a serious suicidal threat does exist, the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student will be notified as soon as possible. If the parent(s)/guardian(s) do not respond, and if for that or any other reason the SS member suspects neglect or abuse could be involved, human services will be notified in accordance with state law and BOE policy. If the SS member is not able to control the student and feels the student may harm themselves, the SS member should contact the police. The student must remain in actual physical custody of a member until a transfer to the parent(s)/guardian(s), police or human services can be made. The building principal is to be kept informed of all steps in this procedure.

If a student attempts suicide during the school day, the building principal and district nurse must be notified as soon as possible. A list of all staff members having such training should be kept by each building principal. If emergency medical care is needed, Emergency Medical Services will be activated. The student's parent(s)/guardian(s) are to be notified as soon as possible.

In the area of postvention, the school district will handle the aftermath of a student's suicide in the following manner:

 A list of mental health personnel (crisis team) who can help students in their immediate reaction to the suicide will be developed and updated on a regular basis. Potential members of this group might include but are not limited to: SS members, human services staff members, clergy members, county nursing staff, morticians, physicians and nurses. These volunteers would be willing to come into the school on a crisis basis to work with individual students or in the classrooms following a suicide.

- These crisis team members, when needed, will be contacted as early as possible, and should meet before they make contact with students. If necessary, they will go into the first hour classes of the building where the suicidee has been a student. Assignments for the crisis team will be determined by the crisis team coordinator and/or the building principal.
- The crisis team would meet with teachers briefly before school to review with them the facts surrounding the suicide and to answer questions about how to deal with students during the school day. Teachers will be informed of a resource room staffed with volunteer mental health personnel, which will be available to students/staff throughout the day. Teachers will make their students aware of this option. Any student who wishes to go to the resource room may go. However, teachers must notify the resource room of any students who are leaving to come to that room.
- Individual members of the crisis team may go into first hour classes. They would spend
 whatever portion of the first hour is necessary discussing the suicide with the students.
 They will also inform the students of the existence of a resource room available to the
 students throughout the day. A member of the crisis team may attend the suicidee's
 classes during the day to help the teachers if needed.
- The crisis team should reconvene after first hour to share their concerns. They will refer any individual students about whom they are concerned to the resource room.
- Some of the members of the crisis team may meet with the teachers over lunch for the purpose of answering their questions and for receiving referrals about individuals who are experiencing difficulty in handling the suicide. The parent(s)/guardian(s) of any student who is having difficulty with the suicide will be contacted.
- If there are sufficient numbers of crisis team volunteers available, they may visit the
 schools in the district that same day to discuss the suicide with staff and to go into
 classrooms where staff feels there is a need to deal with student's questions or reactions.
 The determination as to what needs to be done in other buildings of the district will be
 made by the crisis team coordinator and the building principals.
- Available members of the crisis team will meet with teachers again at the end of the school day to address their own personal concerns and/or their concerns about individual students.
- Any contact with the media shall be made by the district administrator or their designee. An effort should be made to encourage the media to downplay the suicide.
- Within a reasonable amount of time the crisis team coordinator should consider arranging a meeting for parent(s)/guardian(s) to deal with questions about how to work with their children.
- In the event of a suicide attempt, SS will meet and confer about how to handle the student's reentry into school and ongoing intervention. A member of SS shall keep close contact with the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) and the community agency treating the student to assure a coordinated approach in helping the student. Additionally, this staff person shall maintain records of all actions taken by the school, and perform a monitoring and follow-up function after the student returns to class. Teachers involved with the student should be given information to assist them in appropriately dealing with the student.
- When any outside agency is to be utilized, a release of information form should be signed
 by the parent/guardian and student to allow a two-way flow of information between the
 school and the community agency.
- Other crises involving the death of a student or staff member may be handled using the above procedures. The crisis team coordinator and/or the building principal shall make this determination.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) will participate in the Wisconsin Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship (AES) Program as determined by state law. The Board of Education (BOE) shall name the 12th grade student or students who have the highest grade point average(s) in all subjects completed during grades 9-12. The selection procedures followed will be based on state law and guidelines set forth by the Wisconsin Higher Education Aids Board (HEAB). The number of scholars named will be officially designated by the Higher Education Aids Board HEAB based on enrollment.

Annually, at the end of the last full semester preceding February 15, the board of education BOE shall select the senior(s) with the highest grade point average(s) using seven (7) semesters of approved semester grades and based on the decimal system as referenced in the "Grading System" policy (A=4.00, A-=3.67, B+=3.33, B=3.00, B-=2.67, C+=2.33, C=2.00, C-=1.67, D+=1.33, D=1.00, D-=.67, E=.33, F=.00). For purposes of selecting the scholar and alternate, grade point average shall include the same number of places past the decimal that the Medford Area Senior High (MASH) uses on the official high school transcript. Weighted grades, as provided for in district policy, will be used to determine grade point average for the Wisconsin Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship AES. All courses completed at Medford Area Senior High School MASH or transferred in accordance with school policy (as referenced in home-based or transfer policy), during grades 9-12, that are acceptable toward graduation, will be included in the grade point average. In the case of transfer students, only those credits accepted by the school, at the time of transfer, will apply. Courses that are taken outside the regular school calendar and/or curriculum will be counted only if they apply toward graduation and if they have been approved for credit, in writing, by the principal.

In order to qualify for this scholarship, a student must have attended Medford Area Senior High School MASH for two (2) full semesters preceding the senior year and attend for the complete senior year (7th and 8th semester).

For the purpose of this scholarship, a student who has transferred into the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD may be considered to have senior standing when he/she they has have sufficient approved credits so that he/she they can meet all of the Medford Area Senior High School MASH graduation requirements within one school year. A student must also, by the end of the seventh (7th) semester, have at least 20 credits of approved courses that have been assigned a letter grade based on the district's "Grading System" policy. Pass/fail grades, grades earned in another country, or any other grades that have not been approved based on district policy will not be included in the grade point average, nor will they count toward the above required 20 credits.

In the case of ties (two or more students with the same grade point average), the following shall be applied in the order indicated:

- If the tied students have all taken the ACT test, prior to the first day of class their senior year, the student will be selected who has the highest composite standard score on his/her their highest ACT Test, as recorded on his/her their permanent record card. Only ACT Tests already taken and recorded on the permanent record card at the time of determination will be used. If any of the tied students have not taken the ACT Test or if there still exists a tie because of exactly the same ACT composite scores, step two should be used.
- If, after step one has been tried and there is still a tie, the students total grade points shall be
 determined counting only the courses accepted previously for grade point average. The
 student with the most grade points shall be selected.
- If, after both steps have been tried, there still exists a tie, the winner shall be determined by adding the sub scores of the ACT.
- If, after all steps have been tried, there still exists a tie, the winner shall be determined by the flip of a coin conducted by the president of the board of education BOE, at a time to be determined by the board of education BOE.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) will participate in the Wisconsin Technical Excellence Scholarship (TES) Program as determined by state law. The Board of Education (BOE) shall name the 12th grade student or students who have the highest total points based on the Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) ranking system. The selection procedures followed will be based on state law and guidelines set forth by the Wisconsin Higher Education Aids Board HEAB. The number of scholars named will be officially designated by the Higher Education Aids Board HEAB based on enrollment.

In order to be eligible for nomination of a Technical Excellence Scholarship TES, a student must exhibit interest in and plan for a technical career at a Wisconsin Technical College within the Wisconsin Technical College System located within the State of in Wisconsin. A student must be enrolled on a full-time basis by September 30th of the academic year following the academic year in which he or she was designated as a scholar, at a participating Wisconsin Technical college. No student may receive both a Wisconsin Technical Excellence Scholarship (TES and an Academic Excellence Scholarship (AES). In addition, to be an eligible candidate for a TES, a student must also have completed at least one of the following eight (8) eligibility items:

- Be a Career and Technical Education (CTE) Concentrator.
- Participated in a Youth Apprenticeship Program.
- Participated in a Technical High School Diploma Program.
- Participated in a Career and Technical Training Pathway.
- Participated in a Skills Standards Program.
- Completed, or on track to complete, an industry-recognized certification program.
- Participated in a Career and Technical Student Organization (CTSO) in Wisconsin: DECA, FBLA, FCCLA, FFA, HOSA, or Skills USA.
- Completed a technical training program for high school students.

In order to qualify for this scholarship, a student must have attended Medford Area Senior High School (MASH) for two (2) full semesters preceding the senior year and for the entire senior year (7th and 8th semester).

Annually, at the end of the last full semester preceding February 15, the board of education BOE shall select the senior(s) with the highest total points based on the following HEAB ranking system.

- One point is given to a student for each credit earned in high school in CTE courses.
- One point is given to a student for each year of activity in a Career and Technical Student Organization CTSO.
- For the purpose of assigning a ranking among eligible candidates, credit hours in process at the time of nomination should be counted toward the number of credits the student has earned.

In the case of a tie, (two or more students with the same total points) the following shall be applied in the order indicated:

- The student grade point average in all Career and Technical Education (CTE courses taken during grade 9 through 12.
- The students cumulative grade point average earned in all courses taken during grade 9 through 12.

For the purpose of this scholarship, a student who has transferred into the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD may be considered to have senior standing when he/she they has have sufficient approved credits so that he/she they can meet all of the Medford Area Senior High School MASH graduation requirements within one school year. A student must also, by the end of the seventh (7th) semester, have at least 20 credits of approved courses that have been assigned a letter grade based on the district's "Grading System" policy. Gifts of less than significant material value shall not be regarded as policy violation of the policy; however, the gift should not be elaborate or unduly expensive.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) exists to provide a free and appropriate public education. MAPSD may charge student fees for certain activities, courses and services which may require additional funding and may assess charges when school property is damaged, lost or stolen. Budgetary constraints imposed by the State of Wisconsin or the current economic environment justify the institution of student fees.

MAPSD will use these principles to guide decisions pertaining to student fees:

- Graduation required coursework, including textbooks, technology and materials will be provided without student fees.
- Non-graduation required coursework and activities may include fees to offset costs for materials, supplies, personal equipment and uniforms.

Student fees will be reviewed annually in February by the Board of Education (BOE). Fee schedules will be consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

To encourage all students to participate in school activities regardless of the student's financial situation, the board authorizes the district administrator or his/her designee to waive the payment of part or all of student fees if the student or student's parent(s)/guardian(s) demonstrate an inability to pay such fees. Parent(s)/guardian(s) who claim that the financial conditions of their families are such that they cannot afford to pay established fees may request a fee waiver in accordance with established procedures.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) shall maintain Sstudent records shall be maintained in the Medford Area Public School District to assist school personnel in providing appropriate educational experiences for each student in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD.

The board of education (BOE) recognizes the need for confidentiality of student records. Therefore, the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall maintain the confidentiality of student records at collection, storage, disclosure and destruction. Student records shall be available for inspection or release only with prior approval of the parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student except in situations where legal requirements specify release of records without such prior approval.

Building principals shall have primary responsibility for the collection, maintenance and dissemination of student records in accordance with state and federal laws and established procedures. All persons collecting or using student records shall be provided with information concerning confidentiality policies and procedures.

For purposes of board of education BOE policy and its implementing guidelines, student records will include data kept in any form. Confidentiality provisions shall apply to information maintained in record form and oral exchanges regarding the contents of such record information.

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GUIDELINES FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND CONFIDENTIALITY OF STUDENT RECORDS

1. DEFINITIONS

- a. Student records include all data directly related to an individual student, maintained by the school_regardless of record format, other than: [1] notes or records maintained for personal use by teachers or other certified personnel who are required by the state superintendent under s. 115.28 (7) to hold a certificate, license, or permit if such records and notes are not available to others, [2] records necessary for and available only to persons involved in the psychological treatment of a student, and [3] law enforcement unit records.
- b. **Progress records** maintained by the school include a statement of courses taken by the student, the student's grades, the student's attendance record, the student's immunization records, any lead screening records required under §254.162, and records of the student's extracurricular activities.
- c. Behavioral records maintained by the school include psychological tests, personality evaluations, records of conversations, any written statements relating specifically to an individual student's behavior, tests relating specifically to achievement or measurement of ability, student physical health care records other than immunization records, or any lead screening records required under §254.162, law enforcement officers' records_obtained under 48.396(1) or 938.396(1)(b) 2. or (c) 3. and any other student records which are not progress records.
 - [1] The student behavioral records include, but not limited to, referral information [including notices and forms]; signed parental consent or refusal for evaluation; individualized education program team [IEP team] evaluations; individual reports and IEP findings and reports; individualized education programs; placement decisions and signed parental consent or refusal; medical evaluations and prescriptions required to substantiate health treatment services; medical evaluations used to substantiate a disability; and physician's statement required for provision of special education homebound instructional services [see Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Special Education Handbook].

- d. Law Enforcement officer records include those records obtained from a law enforcement agency relating to: [a] the use, possession or distribution of alcohol or a controlled substance by a student enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD, [b] the illegal possession of a dangerous weapon by a student, [c] the act for which a juvenile enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD was adjudged delinquent, and [d] an act for which a district student was taken into custody based on the law enforcement officer's belief that he/she they violated or was violating any state or federal criminal law. The law enforcement agency may provide such record information to the district on its own initiative or upon request of the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator or designee, subject to the agency's official policy. Once the records are received, the student named in the records and the parent(s)/guardian(s) of any minor student named in the records shall be notified of the information.
- e. Court records include those records received from a court clerk concerning a juvenile enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD who: [a] has had a petition filed with a court alleging that he/she they has have committed a delinquent act that would be a felony if committed by an adult, [b] has been adjudged delinquent, [c] has school attendance as a condition of his/her their court dispositional order, or [d] has been found to have committed a delinquent act at the request of or for the benefit of a criminal gang that would be a felony if committed by an adult, and has been adjudged delinquent on that basis.
- f. Student physical health records include basic health information about a student, including the student's immunization records, an emergency medical card, a log of first-aid and medicine administered to the student, an athletic permit card, a record concerning the student's ability to participate in an education program, any lead screening records required under Wis. Stat. 254.162, the results of any routine screening test such as for hearing, vision or scoliosis, and any follow-up to such test, and any other <u>basic</u> health information as determined by the designated state superintendent.
- g. **Student patient health care records -** include all records relating to the health of a student prepared by or under the supervision of a health care provider which are not included in the "student physical health records" definition above.
- h. **School resource officer records -** include all records maintained by a law enforcement unit of the school district that are created by that law enforcement unit for the purpose of law enforcement. Such records are not student records and shall be maintained separately from student records. School resource officer records shall be disclosed only to the extent other law enforcement officers' records are disclosed.
- i. Directory data as designated by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD, includes a student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received and the name of school most recently attended by the student.
- j. Parent means parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem.

k. Adult student - means a student who has attained the age of 18.

2. ACCESS RIGHTS REGARDING STUDENT PROGRESS AND BEHAVIORAL RECORD INFORMATION.

a. Parent(s)/Guardian(s)/Adult Student Access to Student Records

- Parent(s)/guardian(s) shall be permitted to review and inspect any student records relating to their minor child, except as provided in [a] below. Student behavioral records shall be shown to the parent(s)/guardian(s) in the presence of a person qualified to explain and interpret the records [i.e., special education designee for special education student behavioral records; building principal for other student behavioral records]. If any student record includes information on more than one child, the parent(s)/guardian(s) of those children shall have the right to inspect and review only the information relating to their child or to be informed of that specific information. Parent(s)/ guardian(s) will be provided a single copy of their minor child's records upon request.
 - [a] A parent(s)/guardian(s), regardless of whether the parent(s)/guardian(s) has legal custody of the student, shall have equal access to the student's medical, dental and school records unless the parent(s)/guardian(s) has been denied access to such records as outlined by state law [e.g. denied periods of physical placement with the student, ordered by the court].
- [2] Personally identifiable information from the student records of an adult student may be disclosed to the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the adult student without the written consent of the adult student if the adult student is still considered a dependent of his/her their parent(s)/guardian(s) for tax purposes. This may be done unless the adult student has informed the school, in writing, that the information may not be disclosed.
- [3] The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD will respond to parental requests for records without unnecessary delay and in no case more than 45 working days after the request is made.
- [4] A list of the types and locations of student records collected, maintained or used by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall be provided to parent(s)/guardian(s) on request.
- [5] For purposes of board of education BOE policy and these procedures, adult students have all the rights accorded to parent(s)/guardian(s) concerning their own records.

- b. **Minor student Access to Progress Records** A minor student may be shown and provided with a copy of his/her their progress records upon request.
- c. Access to Progress and Behavioral Records by Persons Other Than Parent(s)/Guardian(s)/Students with Consent The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall provide access to a student's behavioral or progress records when a signed authorization by the parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student that consents to the release of information to another party or agency is presented.

For purposes of these procedures, "informed consent" means written consent that includes all of the following information: [a] the name of the student whose record is being disclosed, [b] the type of information to be disclosed, [c] the name of the person[s] making the disclosure, [d] the purpose of the disclosure, [e] the individual, agency or organization to which disclosure may be made, [f] the signature of the student, if an adult, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, [g] the date on which the consent is signed, and [h] the time period during which the consent is effective.

- [1] Upon the written request of an adult student or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, the school shall make available to the person named in the permission form the student's progress records or such portions of his/her their behavioral records as determined by the person authorizing the release. Law enforcement officer record information may not be made available under this exception unless specifically identified by the adult student or by the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student in the written request.
- [2] Annually, on or before August 15, the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall report to the appropriate community services boards established under sections 51.42 and 51.437 the names of students who reside in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD, who are 16 years of age or older, who are enrolled in a special education program, who are not expected to be enrolled in an educational program two years from the date of the report and who may require services under sections 51.42 and 51.437 [community mental health, development disabilities, alcoholism, and drug abuse]. Before filing the report, parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student consent shall be obtained.
- [3] Student Patient Health Care Records: All student patient health care records shall remain confidential. They may be released only to persons specifically designated in state statute or to other persons with the informed consent of the patient or a person authorized by the patient.
- d. Access to Progress and Behavioral Records by Persons Other Than Parent(s)/Guardian(s)/Students without Consent The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall provide access to a student's behavioral or progress records without consent in accordance with any valid court order/ordinances or the following procedures:

- [1] Student records shall be disclosed at the request or order of a court. The district shall make a reasonable effort to notify the parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student of the order in advance of compliance therewith, except as otherwise provided by law.
- [2] Student records may be disclosed to appropriate parties in connection with an emergency if knowledge of the information is necessary to protect the health and safety of any individual.
- [3] If school attendance is a condition of a student's dispositional order under 48.355[2][b]7 or 938.358[2], the board of education BOE shall notify the county department that is responsible for supervising the student within five days after any violation of the condition by the student.
- [4] A law enforcement agency shall be provided a copy of a student's attendance record if the law enforcement agency certifies in writing that the student is under investigation for allegedly committing a criminal or delinquent act and that the law enforcement agency will not further disclose the student's attendance record information except as permitted by law. When a student's attendance record is disclosed to a law enforcement agency for purposes of truancy, the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) shall be notified of that disclosure as soon as practicable after the disclosure.
- [5] Student records shall be made available to school officials who have been determined by the board BOE to have legitimate educational interests, including safety interest, in such records. A "school official" is a person employed by the district who is required by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to hold a license; a person who is employed by or working on behalf of the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor or support staff member (including health or medical staff and police liaison personnel); a person serving on the board of education BOE; a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a specific task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant or therapist); or a person serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her their tasks. A school official has a "legitimate educational interest" if the official needs to review a student record in order to fulfill his/her their professional or district responsibility.

A board of education BOE member or Medford Area Public School District MAPSD employee may not be held personally liable for any damages caused by failure to make student record disclosures to Medford Area Public School District MAPSD employees as outlined above, unless the person acted with actual malice in failing to disclose the information. The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD also may not be held liable for any damages caused by nondisclosure, unless the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD or its agent acted with gross negligence or reckless, wanton or intentional misconduct in failing to disclose the records.

[a] Law enforcement records, including but not limited to AOD, weapons possession, or delinquency-related record information, received by the district may be made available to those school officials with legitimate educational interests, including safety interest, in the information. If law enforcement record information obtained by the district relates to a district student, the information may also be disclosed to those district

employees who have been designated by the board to receive that information for the purpose of providing treatment programs for district students. The information may not be used as the sole basis for suspending or expelling a student from school, or as the sole basis for taking any other disciplinary action against a student, including action under the district's co-curricular code of conduct.

- [b] Court records obtained by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD must be disclosed to Medford Area Public School District MAPSD employees who work directly with the juvenile named in the records or who have been determined by the board of education BOE to have legitimate educational or safety interests in the information. An employee cannot further disclose the information, and the information cannot be used as the sole basis for suspending or expelling a student from school or as the sole basis for taking any other disciplinary action against a student, including action under the district's co-curricular code of conduct.
- [c] Student patient health care records may be released upon request without informed consent to a Medford Area Public School District MAPSD employee or agent, with regard to patient records maintained by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD in which he/she they is are employed or is an agent, if any of the following apply:
 - [1] The employee or agent has responsibility for the preparation or storage of patient health care records.
 - [2] Access to patient health care records is necessary to comply with a requirement in federal or state law.

Any record that concerns the results of a test for the presence of HIV or antibody to HIV [the virus which causes acquired immunodeficiency syndrome - AIDS] shall be confidential and may be disclosed to other persons only with the informed written consent of the test subject.

- [6] A fire investigator shall be provided a copy of a student's attendance record if the fire investigator certifies in writing that:
 - [a] the student is under investigation for arson,
 - [b] the student's attendance record is necessary for the fire investigator to pursue his/her their investigation, and
 - [c] the fire investigator will use and further disclose student's attendance record only for the purpose of pursuing that investigation.
- [7] Student records may be disclosed to a law enforcement agency, district attorney, city attorney, corporation counsel, social welfare agency, juvenile intake worker, court, private school or another school board for the purposes of providing services to the student before adjudication if the disclosure is pursuant to an interagency agreement and the person to whom the records are disclosed certifies that the records will not be further disclosed.

- [8] Student records shall be provided to a court in response to a subpoena for inspection. The court may turn said records or parts thereof over to parties in the action or to their attorneys if these records would be relevant and material to a witness's credibility or competency. The district shall make a reasonable effort to notify parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult students of the subpoena in advance of compliance therewith, except as otherwise provided by law.
- [9] The board of education BOE may provide the state education agency or any other public officer with any information required under Chapters 115 to 121, which covers all aspects of public instruction under the law. The state education agency may secure student or other records which are necessary in connection with the audit and evaluation of state or federal-supported programs or in connection with the enforcement of state or federal requirements which relate to such programs.
- [10] Information from a student's immunization records shall be made available to state and local health officials to carry out immunization requirements.
- [11] Upon request, the board of education BOE clerk shall provide the names of students who have withdrawn from school prior to graduation to the technical college board in which the public school is located or, for verification of eligibility for public assistance, to the Department of Health and Family Services, the Department of Workforce Development or a county department under sections 46.215, 46.22 or 46.23 of the state statutes.
- [12] The district shall, upon request, provide student disciplinary records necessary for purposes of student enrollment in another public school district as permitted by law. These records may include:
 - a. A copy of any expulsion findings and orders or records of any pending disciplinary proceedings involving the student.
 - b. A written explanation of the reasons for the expulsion or pending disciplinary proceedings.
 - c. The length of the term of the expulsion or the possible outcomes of the pending disciplinary proceedings.
- [13] The school district clerk or his/her their designee shall make student records available for inspection or, upon request, disclose the contents of student records to authorized representatives of the Department of Corrections, the Department of Health Services, the Department of Justice, or a district attorney for use in the prosecution of any proceeding or any evaluation conducted under chapter 980 (sexually violent persons commitment), if the student records involve or relate to an individual who is the subject of the proceeding or evaluation. The court in which the proceeding is pending may issue any protective orders that it determines are appropriate concerning student records made available or disclosed under this provision. Any

representative of the Department of Corrections, the Department of Health and Family Services, the Department of Justice, or a district attorney may disclose information obtained under this provision for any purpose consistent with any proceedings under chapter 980.

- [14] Notwithstanding their confidential status, student records may be used in suspension and expulsion proceedings and by individualized education program teams under state special education laws, except as provided in 2-d-5 a. and b.
- e. If a request is received from the Disability Rights Wisconsin Inc. (DRW) for access to the student records of a student with a mental illness who is receiving care and treatment at school, a student with a disability receiving special education services or a student with a Section 504 accommodation plan, for purposes of investigating potential claims of abuse or neglect under applicable federal laws, the request shall be handled as follows:
 - [1] If the DRW provides proof of parental consent to access the records, the district shall provide DRW such access.
 - [2] If DRW does not provide proof of parental consent to access the records, the district shall determine if the conditions for access without parental consent, as defined in applicable federal laws, are met and, if so, provide access to the requested records.
 - [a] If the student whose records are requested has a mental illness and is receiving care or treatment at school but is not eligible for special education services or a Section 504 accommodation plan, DRW's access to the student's records without parental consent is limited to disclosure only when the following three conditions exist: (1) the potential abuse or neglect places the health or safety of the student in serious and immediate jeopardy, (2) DRW has notified the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) of the potential abuse or neglect and has offered assistance, and (3) the parent(s)/guardian(s) has failed or refused to act.
 - [b] If the student whose records are requested is receiving special education services or has a Section 504 accommodation plan, DRW has access to the student's records without parental consent when one of two conditions exist: (1) when the DRW has notified the parent(s)/ guardian(s) of the suspected abuse or neglect of his/ her child, has offered assistance and the parent(s)/ guardian(s) has failed or refused to act, or (2) when the potential abuse or neglect places the health or safety of the student in serious and immediate jeopardy.

The records DRW may be able to access from school include both individual student records and investigative records or reports prepared by school district employees.

[3] If the conditions for disclosure without parental consent are not met or if DRW shows that they have probable cause to investigate suspected abuse or neglect of a student whose identity is unknown but could be determined with further investigation, the district may consider providing DRW with contact information about the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) so that DRW may attempt to obtain consent for access to the records. The building principal shall consult with the district administrator when making this determination.

3. RELEASE OF STUDENT DIRECTORY DATA

Except as provided below, directory data may be disclosed to any person after the school has (1) notified the parent(s)/guardian(s) or guardian ad litem, or adult student of the categories of information which it has designated as directory data with respect to each student, (2) informed such persons that they have 14 days to inform the school that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without their prior consent, and (3) allowed 14 days for the adult student or parent(s)/guardian(s) or guardian ad litem of a minor student to inform the school, in writing, that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without their prior consent. Parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult students can restrict the release of student directory data at any time.

- a. If the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD has followed the notification procedure outlined above, and the parent(s)/guardian(s) does not object to the directory data being released, the board of education BOE clerk shall, upon request, provide the name and address of each student expected to graduate from high school in the current school year to the technical college board.
- b. If the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD has followed the notification procedure outlined above, and the parent(s)/guardian(s) does not object to the directory data being released, the board of education BOE clerk shall, upon request, provide any representative of a law enforcement agency, city attorney, district attorney or corporation counsel, county department under sections 46.215, 46.22 or 46.23 or a court of record or municipal court with such directory data information relating to any such student enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD for the purpose of enforcing that student's school attendance, to respond to a health or safety emergency, or to aid in the investigation of alleged criminal or delinquent activity by a student enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD.
- c. If the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD has followed the notification procedure outlined above, and the parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student does not object to the directory data being released, the board of education BOE clerk shall, upon request by military recruiters provide secondary school students' names, addresses, and telephone listings. The district shall provide military recruiters the same access to secondary students and student directory data about such students as is provided to post-secondary institutions or prospective employers.
- d. Administrators have the discretion to refuse the release of individual student phone

numbers and addresses for the safety of the student. When reviewing student directory data requests, as well as when implementing other provisions of these guidelines, consideration shall be giving to applicable provisions of the public records law and the district's policy and procedures dealing with public records.

4. STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN SURVEYS

- An adult student or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student shall be notified by a. the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD of any student survey containing questions addressing any of the following protected areas: political affiliations or beliefs of the student or parent(s)/guardian(s), mental, or psychological problems of the student or the student's family, sex behavior or attitudes; illegal, anti-social, selfincriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close family relationships; legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships (i.e. lawyers, physicians or ministers); religious practices. affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent(s)/guardian(s); or income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program). At least annually, at the beginning of the school year, the district shall notify the parent(s)/quardian(s)/adult student of the approximate dates during the school year when the district will administer student surveys that contain questions about any of the protected areas. Parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult students shall be provided an opportunity to opt out his or her child from participating.
 - [1] The district shall obtain written consent from parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult students, before administering required student surveys that contain questions about any of the protected areas and that are funded in whole or in part by U.S. Department of Education funds.
 - [2] The district shall offer parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult students an opportunity to opt their child out of participating in activities involving the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information, or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose.
 - [3] Parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult students have the right to review, upon request, any survey that concerns any of the protected areas of information.

5. CHALLENGE/AMENDMENT OF STUDENT RECORDS

- a. An adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, shall have the opportunity to challenge the contents of a student's school records by making a written request directly to the building principal, or to the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator in the event the student is no longer enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD. The written request shall: [1] set forth the specific portion of the school record claimed by the challenger to be in error, inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the student's privacy rights and [2] state the modification[s] requested in respect thereto.
 - [1] If the request is made to a building principal, the principal shall confer with the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator concerning

the request.

- [2] The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator, either from the information provided to him/her them by a building principal or from the individual's direct request to the Administrator, shall make a written response to the adult student or parent(s)/guardian(s). This response shall be within a reasonable time of the receipt of the written challenge by the building principal or Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator.
- b. If the district decides not to amend the record as requested, it shall inform the parent(s)/guardian(s) or eligible student of its decision and of his/her their right to a hearing. He/she They may make a written request for a hearing before the board of education BOE regarding the original challenge. This request shall be directed to the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator within a reasonable period of time after the receipt of the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator's response.
 - [1] The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD Administrator shall, upon receipt of the request for hearing, arrange for a hearing to be held before the board of education BOE within a reasonable time of the receipt of the request therefor.
 - [2] The board of education BOE shall conduct the hearing, take evidence and make its findings, conclusion and order upon the evidence submitted at the hearing, and shall notify the challenging adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, of such findings, conclusion and decision within a reasonable period of time following the conclusion of the hearing.
 - [3] If, as a result of the hearing, the board of education BOE decides that the information is inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the student's privacy rights, it shall amend the information accordingly and inform the adult student, or parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, of such amendment.
 - [4] If, as a result of the hearing, the board of education BOE decides that the information is not inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the student's privacy rights, it shall inform the adult student, or parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, of the right to place in the records it maintains on the student, a statement commenting on the information or setting forth any reasons for disagreeing with the decision of the board of education BOE. The board of education BOE shall require that any explanation placed in the records of a student be maintained by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD as part of the records as long as the record or contested portion is maintained by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD. If the records of the student, or the contested portion are disclosed by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD to any party, the explanation shall also be disclosed to that party.

6. MAINTENANCE OF STUDENT RECORDS

- a. The building principal shall have primary responsibility for maintaining the confidentiality of student records in each school building. All requests for inspection or transfer of student records to another school district or agency shall be directed to the building principal, who will determine whether inspection or transfer is permitted under these procedures. Confidentiality provisions regarding student records apply to information maintained in record form and oral exchanges regarding the contents of such record information.
 - [1] Building principals shall maintain an updated list of staff by name and title who have access to student records.
 - The Medford Area Public School District MAPSD shall keep a record of parties obtaining access to student records collected, maintained or used under these procedures, except access by parent(s)/guardian(s); authorized Medford Area Public School District MAPSD employees whose names and positions are listed; a party with written consent from the parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student; a party with written consent of the parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult student; a party seeking directory data; or a party seeking or receiving the records as directed by a federal grand jury or other law enforcement subpoena and the issuing court or other issuing agency has ordered that the existence or the contents of the subpoena or the information in response to the subpoena not be disclosed.
 - [3] A record of access shall be maintained in each student's file. This record shall include the name of the party, date access was given, and the purpose for which the party was authorized to use the record.
- b. While students are enrolled in school, their progress records will be maintained in the school of attendance. Upon transfer of the a student to another school operated by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD, the records shall be transferred to that school. When the student ceases to be enrolled in a school operated by the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD, his/her their non-special education records will be kept in the building he/she they last attended. Special Education records will be kept by the Director of Special Education.
 - [1] All student records shall be maintained in locked files.
 - [2] Student patient records and law enforcement officer record information shall be maintained separately from a student's other records.

7. TRANSFER OF STUDENT RECORDS

- a. All student records relating to a specific student shall be transferred to another school or school district upon receipt of written notice from:
 - [1] an adult student, or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of a minor student, that the student intends to enroll in the other school or school district;
 - [2] another school or school district that the student has enrolled; or,
 - [3] a court that a student has been placed in a secured correctional facility or

secured group home or secured child caring institution.

- Records will be sent to another school or school district within five working days of receiving the written request.
- c. Student record information shall be disclosed upon receipt of written consent to another agency on the condition that the party to whom the information is disclosed will not disclose the information to any other party without the prior consent of the parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult student. The district shall inform the party to whom disclosure is made of this requirement. This does not apply to the release of directory data, the release of information pursuant to a court order or subpoena, or disclosure to parent(s)/guardian(s)/adult student.

8. <u>DESTRUCTION OF STUDENT RECORDS</u>

- a. The special education designee/coordinator/director shall be responsible for reviewing records of students with special educational needs. Information that is no longer needed to provide educational services to the special education student shall be destroyed after one-month notification to the parent(s)/guardian(s).
- b. All behavioral records shall be destroyed one year after the student graduates or last attends school, except with written parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student permission to retain special education records for a longer period of time for audit purposes. Where such permission is received, behavioral records shall be maintained for the time period specified in the written permission or as long as the district's needs require. If written parent(s)/guardian(s) or adult student consent to maintain special education records for a period longer than one year is not granted, all personal identifiers will be removed from records and they shall be maintained until no longer needed to satisfy federal record maintenance requirements.
- c. Student progress records shall be destroyed 6-7 years after the student ceases to be enrolled in the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD or upon notification of the former student's death.

9. ANNUAL PUBLIC NOTICE

Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students shall be notified annually of the following: [a] their rights to inspect, review and obtain copies of student records; [b] the existence of the student records policy and procedures and where copies can be obtained; [c] the categories of student record information which have been designated as directory data and their right to deny the release of such information within 14 days of receipt of notification; [d] their rights to request amendment of the student's school records if they believe the records are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's rights of privacy; [e] their rights to consent to the disclosure of the student's school records, except to the extent state and federal law authorizes disclosure without consent and, [f] their right to file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office of the U.S. Department of Education.

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Provisions shall be made to effectively notify parent(s)/guardian(s) when the parent(s)/guardian(s)' primary language is other than English. Parent(s)/guardian(s) of secondary school students shall also be notified of their option to request the district not to release the secondary school student's name, address or telephone listing to military recruiters or institutions of higher education without prior written parental consent.

When a student transfers into the Medford Area Public School District MAPSD after the above notice has been given, the student and his/her their parent(s)/guardian(s) shall receive a copy of the notice.

10. COMPLAINTS REGARDING ALLEGED NON-COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

Adult students or parent(s)/guardian(s) of minor students may file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office of the U.S. Department of Education for alleged district non-compliance with requirements of the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

Hired before July 1, 2020

Eligibility - To be eligible for this benefit & recognition, the teacher must:

- 1) Retire effective at the conclusion of the school year (June 30).
- 2) Attain the age of fifty-five (55) by the end of the contract year (June 30) in which he/she intends to retire and have a minimum of 15 years of service in the District.
- Notify the district in writing by March 20 or another date if mutually agreed upon by the teacher and the District of his/her intention to retire at the end of the school year.
- 4) Complete the school year immediately preceding the date of retirement.

Health Insurance - Upon retirement, the retired teacher will be eligible to be included in the district's current health insurance program subject to the rules, regulations and eligibility requirements of the insurance carrier. However, the retired teacher is not required to remain covered by the district's health insurance program to be eligible for the benefit described below. The retiree may choose to delay the receipt of the benefit described below; however, delay of the benefit will not affect the amount provided to the retiree.

Effective July 1, 2026: The duration of coverage on the District's health insurance program for those retiring on or after July 1, 2026, is based upon COBRA continuation coverage election and COBRA-specified coverage period. The retiree and/or eligible family members may choose to continue coverage on the District's health insurance plan, provided they pay 100% of the COBRA premiums.Note that retirees may only remain on the District's health insurance plan for the duration of COBRA.

Post-Employment Premium Only HRA: Upon retirement, the Board shall pay into a Premium Only Retiree Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) a one-time lump sum amount as outlined below upon retirement. These funds are available to the retired teacher, their spouse, qualifying dependents, and surviving spouse and/or surviving qualifying dependent until the funds are exhausted. The benefit is prorated for in-between years and there will be an additional \$1,000 per year for 30+ years:

6.11 Educational Assistance

The Medford Area Public School District believes that education leads to self-improvement and recognizes that the skills and knowledge of its employees are critical to the success of the district. In that vein, the Medford Area Public School District encourages higher education and is willing to offer incentives for professional development opportunities which are directly related to an employee's present job or which will help an employee prepare for more responsibilities or promotions within the district.



Hired before July 1, 2020

Eligibility - To be eligible for this benefit & recognition, we are only considering your primary position. The support staff must:

- 1) Work a minimum of nine (9) months per school year.
- 2) Attain the age of fifty-five (55) by the end of the contract year (June 30) in which he/she intends to retire and have a minimum of 15 years of service in the District.

Insurance Provision – For support staff who do not qualify for the above referenced benefit and for support staff who have exhausted their retirement benefits as described above, upon retirement, support staff may continue in the Health Insurance Plan, offered by the District to active employees, subject to the rules of the insurance carrier, providing they pay their own premium.*

*Effective July 1, 2026:

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Insurance Premiums Post-Employment Premium Only HRA - Upon retirement, the Board shall pay into a Premium Only Retiree Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) a one-time lump sum amount in the amount as outlined below one-time upon retirement. These funds are available to the retired staff member, their spouse, qualifying dependents and surviving spouse and/or surviving qualifying dependent until the funds are exhausted. The benefit is prorated for in-between years and there will be an additional \$600 per year for 30+ years:

Part-time employees will be eligible for this retirement benefit at a prorated amount.

Hired on or after July 1, 2020

Eligibility - To be eligible for this benefit & recognition, we are only considering your primary position. The support staff must:

- 1) Work a minimum of nine (9) months per school year.
- 2) Attain the age of fifty-five (55) by the end of the contract year (June 30) in which they intend to retire and have a minimum of 15 years of service.
- Notify the district in writing by March 20 or another date if mutually agreed upon by the support staff and the District of their intention to retire at the end of the school year.
- Complete the school year immediately preceding the date of retirement.
- 5) During active years of employment, the District will fund \$375 per year of service, beginning with the 2020-21 fiscal year, into an irrevocable trust.

The benefit shall be applied available to pay reimburse for 100% of the applicable premium to remain on the District's health insurance program or an outside health insurance plan until the benefit is exhausted.* A retiree's benefits may be combined with those of their spouse. If both spouses are support staff are employed by the Medford Area Public School District, each spouse may be eligible for the Premium Only HRA based upon the eligibility as noted above. Should a any retiree receiving benefits under this section die before exhausting the benefit, the surviving spouse shall continue to receive the benefit until the benefit has been exhausted or until the death of the surviving spouse, whichever occurs first.

Insurance Provision – For support staff who do not qualify for the above referenced benefit and for support staff who have exhausted their retirement benefits as described above, upon retirement, support staff may continue in the Health Insurance Plan, offered by the District to active employees, subject to the rules of the insurance carrier, providing they pay their own premium.*

*Effective July 1, 2026:

The duration of coverage on the District's health insurance program for those retiring on or after July 1, 2026, is based upon COBRA continuation coverage election and the COBRA-specified coverage period. The retiree and/or eligible family members

may choose to continue coverage on the District's health insurance plan, provided they pay 100% of the COBRA premiums. Note that retirees may only remain on the District's health insurance plan for the duration of COBRA.

Eligible employees shall be required to contribute to the Wisconsin Retirement System the full employee-required contribution, as per the Employee Trust Funds Board. The District shall contribute the employer-required contribution.

Unused personal leave pursuant to Section 7.6 of this handbook shall be paid out at a rate of \$60.00 per day upon retirement.

Unused sick leave will be paid into the Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) at a rate of \$60.00 per day up to 96 days upon retirement.

6.11 Training and Professional Development

A specific schedule of basic training and orientation has been established for each job and employment classification. The Medford Area Public School District encourages all interested employees to take advantage of the continuing education initiative and further job specific training. All courses must be approved by a supervisor and District Administrator.

6.12 Health Savings Account

The district may make a deposit to all qualified participant's Health Savings Account each payroll period.



Consideration for all professional staff to Start out the school year Employee Handbook - Professional Staff Members with 6 days.

7.1 Leaves

Full-time employees are eligible to receive the leave benefits as described below. The District will pro-rate all leave benefits, including cumulative sick leave, for regular part-time professional staff members.

Any professional staff member obtaining leave benefits by fraud, deceit, or falsified statement or otherwise abusing the District's leave benefits, shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

7.2 Sick Leave

All professional staff will be allocated twelve (12) days of sick leave on July 1. Sick leave can be used for absences caused by illness or disability of which twelve (12) days may be used for care of a sick dependent child living in the home of the professional staff member. In addition, sick leave can be used for medical and dental appointments of the professional staff member. Sick leave deductions will be made in hour increments. Sick leave shall be cumulative to one hundred eight (108) 120 days. A professional staff member who has been absent from work due to illness may be required to provide medical verification of his/her illness and/or to submit to an examination by a licensed physician at the District's expense.

Misuse of sick leave shall mean loss of pay for the days alleged as sick leave and may result in other appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

Sick leave requests shall be made to the building principal.

A professional staff member under this section who has accumulated ene hundred eight (108)-120 days of sick leave will be reimbursed for unused cumulative sick leave above the one hundred eight-108 days at the end of a school year at the rate of \$60.00 \$75.00 per day. Payment will be made prior to Christmas at the end of the fiscal year of the following school year. A professional staff member who resigns after April 15 loses any right to reimbursement under this paragraph.

7.3 Personal Leave

All personal leave requests must be submitted to the employee's immediate supervisor. A professional staff member will be allowed up to earn two (2) days of personal leave with pay during each school year. Starting with the fifteenth year of service, a professional staff member will earn one additional personal leave day per school year. Personal leave days may be taken consecutively, and combined with any other leave, including unpaid leave. Under this provision, a professional staff member may bank any unused personal leave during a contract year. up to a maximum of three (3) days. They may carry over the three (3) banked days to be used in any subsequent year. A professional staff member can start a school year with no more six (6) personal days which includes both banked and earned personal days. The maximum number of total personal days used in one school year may not exceed five (5) days.

Personal leave deductions will be made in hour increments. Except in the case of emergency, forty-eight (48) hours advance written request to the principal or supervisor is required. Professional staff members planning to use three (3) five (5) or more consecutive days must submit a written request to the principal or supervisor at least fourteen (14) working days prior to the first day of the requested leave. No more than three (3) professional staff members per building at MASH, MAMS, MAES, and two (2) professional staff members per building at SES may be absent per school day for personal leave. Leave under this section shall not extend holiday or vacation periods that are themselves three or more days in length and may not be used on the first or last day of student instruction or during a scheduled inservice day or parent-teacher conference day. Exceptions may be made for a family event or situation that falls on the first or last day of student instruction, scheduled inservice day, parent-teacher conference day, or prior to or after a holiday break. Any requests that fall under this description must be brought to the attention of the District Administrator. The same staff member per building limit applies.

If an unforeseen reason develops, the District Administrator or their designee may waive the three (3) professional staff members per building at MASH, MAMS, MAES, and two (2) professional staff members per building at SES rule and/or the extension of a holiday or vacation rule.

A staff member with more than three (3) the allowed banked personal leave days at the end of a school year will be paid out for all unused personal leave days over three (3) at a rate of \$60.00 \$75.00 per day, prorated for partial days. Payment will be made prior to Christmas at the end of the fiscal year of the following school year. A professional staff member who resigns after April 15 loses any right to reimbursement under this paragraph.

Misuse of personal leave shall mean loss of pay for the days alleged as personal leave and may result in other appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

7.4 Unpaid Leave

Unpaid leave may only be requested after you have exhausted all paid leave. A professional staff member will be allowed two (2) unpaid days per school year. An unpaid day will result in a salary reduction. Unpaid leave deductions will be made in hour increments. Additional unpaid leave requests will be considered on an individual basis. Additional days will result in a salary reduction as well as the pro-rated cost of health and dental insurance.

7.5 Funeral Leave

A professional staff member is eligible for up to three (3) days, with pay, in the event of a death in the immediate family of the professional staff member or spouse (immediate family is defined as spouse, mother, mother-in-law, step mother, father, father-in-law, step father, child, sister, step sister, brother, step brother, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, grandparent, step grandparent, great grandparent, grandchild, foster parent, or foster child). If additional time off becomes necessary and is



Employees who are scheduled to work 1,700 or more hours per year will be allocated twelve (12) days of sick leave on July 1. Sick leave can be used for absences caused by illness or disability of which twelve (12) days of sick leave for care of a sick dependent child living in the home of the employee that works 1,700 or more hours per year.

Employees who are scheduled to work 1,699 or less hours per year will be allowed nine (9) days of sick leave on July 1. Sick leave can be used for absences caused by illness or disability of which nine (9) days of sick leave for care of a sick dependent child living in the home of the employee that works 1,699 or less hours per year.

In addition, sick leave can be used for medical and dental appointments of the employee. Sick leave deductions will be made in 15 minute increments. Sick leave shall be cumulative to ninety-six (96) 108 days.

An employee who has been absent from work due to illness may be required to provide medical verification of his/her illness and/or to submit to an examination by a licensed physician at the District's expense.

Full-time, 9-month employees may substitute sick leave or personal leave days in place of unpaid leave days due to district cancellations.

In the event that an employee's normal work day changes, the employee's accumulated sick leave shall be converted to hours and apportioned over the employee's new work schedule; provided, under no circumstances shall the accumulation exceed ninety-six (96) days 108 days.

In the event that a paid holiday falls within the week or weeks when the employee is on paid sick leave, such holiday will be charged as a paid holiday and not deducted from the employee's accrued sick leave.

Misuse of sick leave shall mean loss of pay for the days alleged as sick leave and may result in other appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

Sick leave requests shall be made to the building principal/supervisor.

Payment for unused sick leave — A staff member who has accumulated ninety-six (96) 108 days of sick leave will be reimbursed for unused cumulative sick leave above the ninety-six (96) days at the end of the school year at a rate of \$60.00 per day. Payments will be made prior to Christmas at the end of the fiscal year of the following school year. This benefit will be prorated according to the number of scheduled hours of work per day with 7.5 or more hours per day or, if less, the maximum number of hours allocated for that classification being considered a full day.

An hourly employee with ten (10) or more years of service whose services are terminated for any reason other than discharge, will be compensated for all unused sick leave at a rate of \$60.00 per day provided termination is effective on or before the day following the last day of classes for the school year.

Assistants, AV Technicians, Bus Drivers, Cooks, Custodians, Secretaries, & Specialists

7.5 Funeral Leave

An employee is eligible for up to three (3) days, with pay, in the event of a death in the immediate family of the employee or spouse (immediate family is defined as spouse, mother, mother-in-law, step mother, father, father-in-law, step father, child, sister, step sister, brother, step brother, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, grandparent, step grandparent, great grandparent, grandchild, foster parent, or foster child). If additional time off becomes necessary and is requested by the employee and approved by the District Administrator or designee, then the additional time off shall be deducted from the employee's sick leave.

A leave without loss of pay for one (1) full day will be allowed for attendance at a funeral of those relatives of the employee or spouse not covered in the first paragraph of this section. Relatives in this section shall mean: uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, or cousins. If such leave is approved, a day of sick leave will be deducted from the employee's cumulative sick leave.

Misuse of funeral leave shall mean loss of pay for the days alleged as funeral leave and may result in other appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

7.6 Personal Leave

All personal leave requests must be submitted to the employee's immediate supervisor. Employees will be allowed earn one (1) day of personal leave with pay each school year. Employees completing their fourth year of service, will receive an additional personal leave day each school year. Personal leave days may be taken consecutively and combined with any other leave, including unpaid leave. Personal leave deductions will be made in 15 minute increments. Under this provision, an employee will bank any unused personal leave during a school year up to a maximum of three (3) four (4) days. Employees may carry over the three (3) four (4) banked days to be used in any subsequent year. The maximum number of total personal days used in one school year may not exceed four (4) days. Except in the case of emergency, forty-eight (48) hours advance notice to the principal or supervisor is required. Employees planning to use two (2) or more consecutive days must submit written request to the principal or supervisor at least fourteen (14) working days prior to the first day of the requested leave. No more than two (2) employees per department per building per day may be absent for personal leave. Leave under this section shall not extend holiday/vacation periods that are themselves three (3) or more days in length and may not be used on inservice days by an employee scheduled to attend inservice activities on said days and may not be used on the first or last day of student instruction. Exceptions may be made for a family event or situation that falls on the first or last day of student instruction, scheduled inservice day, parent-teacher conference day, or prior to or after a holiday break. Any requests that fall under this description must be brought to the attention of the District Administrator. The same staff member per building limit applies.

A staff member that has more than three (3) four (4) personal leave days at the end of the school years will be paid for all unused personal leave days over three (3) at a rate of \$60.00 per day. Payment for this unused leave will be made prior to Christmas at the end of the fiscal year of the following school year. This benefit will be prorated according to the number of scheduled hours of work per day with 7.5 or more hours per day or, if less, the maximum number of hours allocated for that classification being considered a full day.

66.0301 Affiliated Member Agreement: Shared Virtual Learning Services Between Rural Virtual Academy (RVA) and Oconto Falls School District 2021 - 2022

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes 66.0301, 120.25 and Department of Public Instruction Chapter PI-14.02, the Rural Virtual Academy (RVA) and Oconto Falls School District agree to form a consortium to provide year round virtual learning services to Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12 students residing in the Oconto Falls School District for the term of one school year.

Program Description [PI-14.02(b)]:

Upon approval of this agreement, the Rural Virtual Academy will be allowed to enroll pupils from families seeking virtual learning educational options from the Oconto Falls School District and provide them instructional services in accordance with this contract and RVA's operating policies and procedures.

The RVA will provide the District's designated contact with copies of each student enrollee's academic achievement reports and assessment data.

Students acquiring enough credits for graduation will be granted a diploma from the Oconto Falls School District meeting all necessary graduation requirements of the Oconto Falls School District. The Oconto Falls School District agrees that any additional local graduation requirements not provided by the RVA educational programming will be communicated to the students by Oconto Falls School District personnel in a timely manner as to not delay the graduation of a student on track to meet all graduation requirements.

The Oconto Falls School District retains determination and all associated special education and/or related services should they be needed for RVA students. The RVA will not over-cost for special education services as they will remain under the direct control of the Oconto Falls School District. If an IEP team is created for student of Oconto Falls School District attending the RVA, then the RVA requests to have a teacher represented on such team.

The Oconto Falls School District agrees to provide to its RVA parents the option of receiving in-district intervention programming and progress monitoring services to

children who are referred for a specific learning disability.

The Oconto Falls School District agrees to coordinate, schedule, and proctor all required State assessments.

The Oconto Falls School District agrees to allow its resident RVA students access to regular school programming including but not limited to: academic classes, elective courses, activities, clubs, extra- curriculars, co-curriculars, athletics, etc.

The RVA will provide access to digital learning curriculum and ongoing professional development for blended learning use in classrooms with the Oconto Falls School District.

Fiscal Agent [PI-14.02(c)1,2,3 (e)]:

The RVA, under the authorization and fiscal oversight of the Medford Area Public School District, will be the fiscal agent. RVA instructors will operate in accordance of Wisconsin statute and follow the RVA's operational policies, salary schedule, take part in staff development, and be supervised by RVA administration. The RVA will account for all employment responsibilities (teacher retirement, worker's compensation, and unemployment insurance).

As fiscal agent, the RVA will establish and maintain records in accordance with the uniform accounting system prescribed by the Department of Public Instruction under §115.28(13); file all required financial reports with the Department of Public Instruction; and, upon request of the Department, file a copy of the contract and the plan of operation with the Department.

The Oconto Falls School District will be assessed at an agreed per pupil amount (tuition). For state aid purposes, pupil membership will be counted by the Oconto Falls School District. The tuition amount will be prorated to the number of days of enrollment by each participating student. Tuition is determined to be the annual public school open enrollment dollar amount determined by the Department of Public Instruction on an annual basis **less \$2,250 per pupil**. Different open enrollment dollar amounts exist for both regular and special education students. This amount is variable and billed at the end of year reconciliation.

The Oconto Falls School District will be provided access to all the courses available through the Wisconsin eSchool Network (Wisconsin Digital Learning Collaborative) and other curricular contracts held by the RVA. Professional development and ongoing technical support and training will be provided to the Oconto Falls School District staff by the RVA.

The Oconto Falls School District will be charged all associated costs for content of digital courses in the same amount the RVA is charged for acquiring those courses from the Wisconsin eSchool Network and other curriculum vendors under contract with the RVA. This amount is fixed at the rate per courses which are "licensed," "owned," or "digital access" by the Wisconsin eSchool Network, or other curriculum vendors under contract with the RVA, and billed at the end of year reconciliation.
