General Contractor Safety Requirements

3. Contractors must be trained in all OSHA required topics (electrical safety, lockout/tagout, respiratory protection, hearing conservation, hazard communication, confined space entry, emergency procedures, fire suppression equipment, and first aid) prior to beginning work.

Contractors must utilize all necessary Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for their work including: <ol> <li>Hard hats</li> <li>Safety glasses</li> <li>Face protection</li> <li>Work gloves</li> <li>Hearing protection</li> <li>Specialty equipment as required for specific tasks (welding equipment, respirators, etc).</li> </ol> </li> </ul>		
5. All contractor tools, scaffolding, ladders, forklifts, cranes, hoisting equipment, etc., must be in good condition, properly rated for the job, and meet all applicable OSHA and industry standards.		
6. Contractor equipment and tools must be inspected by the user for defects prior to use.		
<ol> <li>All contractor compressed gas bottles must be properly handled, transported, and stored.</li> <li>Contractor work area must be secured to prevent unauthorized personnel from entering the work area.</li> </ol>		
9. All containers must be labeled as to contents and applicable MSDS information.		
10. The use of alcohol or non-prescription drugs or the possession of weapons of any kind is strictly prohibited. Contractors must		
exercise good housekeeping practices at all times and maintain a safe and orderly work site.		
11. All contractor electrical installations or repairs must be performed by a qualified electrician.		
12. All contractors should be aware lead and/or asbestos hazards may exist within school district owned/leased facilities.
