State statute requires that all students through grade 12 and children attending day care centers must meet minimum immunization requirements. These requirements can be waived only for reasons of health, religious or personal conviction. A waiver for health reasons also requires certification by a licensed physician that the required immunization is or may be harmful to the health of the student.

Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) nurse shall implement the steps of the "Wisconsin Student Immunization Law Timeline" as prescribed in state statute and the administrative procedures of the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services using the legal forms provided.

Students with filed waivers are compliant. However, they may be subject to exclusion from school in the event of an outbreak of diseases against which they are not completely immunized.

It is MAPSD policy that:

- The School District Nurse shall be responsible for supervising, maintaining and monitoring immunization records throughout the district to ensure compliance as prescribed by state law.
- Upon admission to the district, each student will have in their health file an immunization record as required by law. These immunization forms are available in each school office.
- Pursuant to state and federal laws, no person, on the basis of age, sex, race, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, religion, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability may be denied admission to any school in this district or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of or be discriminated against in any co-curricular, student services or other program.
