Medford Area Public School District (MAPSD) needs to be a protected environment where students, staff and citizens feel secure and safe from those whose actions the board of education (BOE) deems improper, unsafe, disruptive, violent or disorderly. Further, the BOE feels the standard of all conduct is not only the absence of the above acts but rather the demonstration of conduct that meets a high standard in terms of responsibility, example and judgment.

No person on district property shall:

- Use profane, abusive or defamatory language, issue threats, commit violent acts or commit acts which are potentially harmful, disruptive or destructive.
- Damage the property of another or of MAPSD.
- Conduct themselves in such manner as to impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the educational program of MAPSD or any other activity taking place on district property, which has been authorized by the BOE, district administrator, building principal or other district employee.
- Enter upon any portion of district premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and/or authorized by the BOE.
- Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the BOE or administration designed to maintain public order on district property.

Any person involved in any of the above acts or in any acts which have or may have the potential for disturbing or disrupting an activity in any way shall be advised by supervisory personnel to cease and desist from such acts. Refusal to cooperate with the instructions of supervisory personnel shall constitute grounds for immediate removal from the premises. The assistance of law enforcement officials may be sought in those instances where an individual(s) refuses to comply with this policy or with other reasonable requests consistent with its intent. Persons ejected from the premises or programs may be restricted from future events or from being on district property for an extended period of time as determined by the district administrator or their designee and may be referred to law enforcement officials for further sanctions per state statute and/or local ordinance.
